

TINTYPE photography by JEFF HOWLETT

You all know what a tintype photograph is. Some people call it old-timey and many have gone to an amusement park and had a digital image taken and it was modified to look black and grey or brown and black. Either way, you've seen the modern rip-off, even if you haven't seen a real tintype yourself.

If you google the term, you will see many images of people not smiling in tintype pictures. It's an interesting thing not to smile- as we all remember growing up being urged to do so. There are many reasons why they didn't smile in said oldtimey photographs. Most of them were taken of people at war time or at times of poverty - no reason to smile there. Some were taken of important people (writers, mathematicians, explorers) who didn't want to go down in history with that one photograph - that one chance - as a clown. Some people used to think that smiling wasn't civil. But I know when I heard we had someone in our area doing actual tintype photograph, that gave me reason to smile. Rock Hill's Jeff Howlett has a studio completely dedicated to capture tintypes and developing them in the oldtimey technique of lacquer on metal. It's wonderful. I had a family tintype done myself. Having apprenticed under an Ellen Susan, Jeff has been doing tintypes for two years now. He's an IT professional as his 9 to 5 but still manages to book upwards of fifty shoots a week.

"Filmmaking and photography are my passionate core, however being a single father I have to balance finances with my art. I produce images when I am not spending time with my children. I have a wonderful relationship with my children's mother, so we are able to balance family time fairly."

In this wet tintype photograph process, Jeff uses a collodion emulsion with silver that literally ends up making your image. The process is fascinating and Jeff is dedicated to helping his client obtain a timeless image of themselves or with their families. The most popular size he shoots is a 4X5 and that runs you \$40.00. You can hire him for an event (who wouldn't want to leave your wedding with their own tintype) or you can book an appointment to see him in the studio. You'll be glad that you did.



⁶⁶Charlotte has a lot of wonderful breweries and we don't have to travel out of town for beer anymore...but that doesn't mean we shouldn't.⁹⁹ I've said it before and I'll say it again: Charlotte has a lot of wonderful breweries and we don't have to travel out of town for beer anymore... but that doesn't mean we shouldn't. Hickory isn't too far away and Olde Hickory Brewery is nothing to scoff at.

With three locations in downtown Hickory alone, over twenty years of experience and a presence in over thirty restaurants and taprooms in the Charlotte area, I'm impressed. Enough so to venture down and often visit their taproom. And as a bonus I get to enjoy the Blue Ridge Mountains.

Oh, and their beer festivals! Not to scoff at our beer festivals, but Hickory puts ours to shame with over sixty regional breweries, bottled water, peanut can or pretzel necklaces and live music. Here we are lucky to have access to bathrooms and the ability to taste ten beers. I even get to leave with a collectible glass glass. Not a dixie cup or the run of the mill BPA-leaking plastic thingy thing. A real glass. You can expect to see some of their most popular brews; Hickory Stick Stout, Oak Aged Redeemer, Seven Devils, Death by Hops and Daniel Boone.

This year it is on Saturday, April 25th at Olde Hickory Station in Hickory. It's called the www.HickoryHops.com Beer Fest. There will be live music by Baby Black Orchestra and it will feature beers from Asheville Brew., Aviator, Bearwaters, Beer Army Combat, Birdsong, Blind Squirrel, Boone Brew./Blowing Rock Brew., Brevard Brew., Bull City, Carolina Brew., Catawba Brew., Deep River, Duck-Rabbit, Foothills, French Broad, Frog Level, Front Street, Fullsteam, Gizmo, Green Man, Heinzelmannchan, Heist, Highland, Howard, Huske Hardware House, Lexington Ave., Liberty, LoneRider, Mash House, Mother Earth, Mystery, Nantahala, Natty Greene's, New South, Olde Hickory, Oskar Blues, Outer Banks, Oyster House, Pisgah, RJ Rockers, Raleigh Brew., Red Brick/Atlanta Brew., Sierra Nevada, SweetWater, Thomas Creek, Tipping Point, Top of the Hill, Triangle, Triple C., Trophy and Wicked Weed.

If you're lucky, you'll get yelled at by a religious sign-toting zealot (warning you of the dangers of hop consumption) as you enter the festival, but you're sure to been presented with way more beer than you can physically try (trust me, I attempted). So ... no kids, no dogs and no amateurs (at the festival). Take that drive.














LINDA MARTINEZ: STYLE MAVEN


Dear Clown,
