

Motorcycle Massacre

You probably wouldn't even glance twice at the Western Waterproofing building that stands at 2500 Allen Road South off of Graham Street; it's just one of several innocuous structures on a road that is lined with similar industrial construction and warehouses that don't exactly capture one's architectural imagination. Located north of downtown Charlotte, the Derita neighborhood where you find this rather dull street is an ethnically diverse area with a wide variety of older and more modern homes as well as a wealth of churches, businesses, parks and schools --- it's a community of hard working people, and by all accounts it's a great place in the city to settle down to live and raise a family. On the morning of July 4th, 1979 however, there was a small two room green shingled house at 2500 Allen Road South, and it was the scene of the bloodiest unsolved mass murder in the Queen City's history.

Located between a grocery store and a trucking terminal, the house had long served as a gathering place for a Charlotte faction of the Outlaws, a one-percenter motorcycle club established in Chicago in 1935 that had spread across the United States in the 1970's. A gentleman known as William "Water Head" Allen, 22, was discovered shot to death on the front porch of the house, and four more bodies were discovered inside; they had all been shot multiple times, and one of the corpses had reportedly been mutilated. There was no sign of a struggle, and the four victims inside were found face down and had been shot execution-style. One of the dead was 17 year old Bridgette "Midget" Benfield, a teenaged "old lady" in training in biker parlance; the other three killed were Outlaw members Leonard "Terrible Terry"

Henderson, 29, William "Mouse" Dronenberg, and Randall Feazell, 28. Allen had been a prospective member of the club, and it was assumed that he had been on guard duty outside of the house that morning since his own shotgun was found near his body. William "Chains" Flamont, president of the Charlotte Outlaws chapter, found the gruesome scene early that morning, and it likely happened between 2 am and 5 am. Police believed that two suspects wielding a 9mm and a .223 semi-automatic may have been known to Allen and that their attack caught him by surprise, and they quickly went inside to kill the other occupants of the house that had probably been asleep. The suspects fired approximately 40 shots, and the entire bloody massacre probably took less than 15 seconds total.


From the beginning the case proved hard to solve, as witnesses disappeared or refused to talk, intimidated by biker culture and its penalties for betrayal. The Outlaw motto, for example, is "God Forgives, Outlaws don't," and if anyone had heard the shots or knew who the perpetrators were, no one was telling the cops. Whispered reports blamed the local wing of the Hell's Angels, sworn enemies of the Outlaws. Charlotte chapters of the two gangs had been struggling for control of the city's massage parlors and methamphetamine traffic, but violence had escalated between them lately rooted in Canada, where a lot of the local Outlaws had recently become involved in various ventures. Some believed this was the Angels' retribution for Outlaw involvement in the ongoing war up north; in 1978, some Outlaws had shot six Angels and associates at a Montreal bar, killing three and badly injuring two. In the early 1970s, national Hell's Angels and Outlaw groups absorbed clubs of independent bandit bikers in the Charlotte area, fueled by drugs, prostitution, and violence; there were about 50 Hell's Angels and close to 20 Outlaws operating in the Charlotte area at the time of the murders. Police tied several killings in Mecklenburg and Gaston counties to the Outlaws and the Angels in the '70s, but could not show conclusive evidence of a local gang war between the two factions.


Yves Lavigne, a self-styled North American "expert" on motorcycle gangs, proposes that the Charlotte killings were only one of four locations targeted nationwide around that time by a rival motorcycle club that he did not name. There was also a theory about the killings being done by disgruntled Outlaw associates, or by prospective members who were denied membership and came back for retaliation. This second theory was put forth based on the lack of a visible struggle, as if the killers were known to the victims; some even blamed Flamont himself along with the club treasurer for the bloody power play.




The Outlaws have remained active in NC since the infamous "July 4th Massacre" on a much smaller scale; The FBI sent about 13 members and associates of the North Carolina branch of the Outlaws to federal prison in the late 1990s, breaking up the gang's stranglehold on methamphetamine trafficking in the state. In 2010, a federal grand jury indicted 27 members of the Outlaws, including 10 from North Carolina, on charges ranging from attempted murder to drug distribution. Agents raided the Newton chapter of the biker gang, and Charlotte-Mecklenburg police SWAT officers assisted with the arrests in Mecklenburg County. The indictment linked the gang to planning assaults on rival gangs, one of them being a chapter of the Hells Angels in York County, S.C. Largely forgotten by many, the July 4th massacre remains one of Charlotte's most notorious unsolved crimes during a bloody chapter in the city's history. Some Outlaws actually still carry a mark with the date 7-4-79 on their jackets to commemorate it, and no one may ever know what actually happened in the house on Allen Road early that morning. So, if you're ever off of Graham Street one day and you think how absolutely boring it is and that nothing exciting could possibly happen there, know that it was a very different story 35 years ago. Also if anyone ever laughs at the notion that Charlotte was ever a rough and bloody town... you can remind them of this gruesome little tale.






The Knights

Now that Spring has finally caught its steam and pushes us headlong through a pollen cloud toward summer, that glorious distraction of baseball once again shakes off the frost of winter and energizes all our senses, heralding the brilliance and heat of summer. In Charlotte, the occasion has more momentum than it's had in probably 20 years, as the Knights come back home to the city from their long lower Carolinian sojourn in Fort Mill at "The Castle." The AAA club's new digs are located on Mint St., the new BB&T Ballpark, may have a name that is a bit less on-the-nose, but it is having a huge impact on the city.

What makes a good baseball stadium is that it holds the character of the city it serves. Your Wrigleys, your Fenways, they'd be iconic on their own, sure, but it's that focusing effect that a baseball stadium has for the community that really makes those places become landmarks. Badges of the city. Uptown Charlotte is making one hell of a play for that right now. The ballpark is across the street from a brand new jewel in the city's park system, Romare Bearden Park. The stands and the Home Run Deck offer the kind of view of Charlotte's skyline about which poster manufacturers could only

dream (count the panoramic field view pics uploaded to Facebook in the Charlotte area since the stadium opened April 11th). The vendors feature a heavy local presence with several regional breweries represented, including a new Knights-themed ale from NoDa Brewing Company (now fresh off a big win in the IPA category at the World Beer Cup). We're putting our best on display here, and the impression is, well... impressive.

Ballparks have been on the bounce lately as engines of economic revitalization. Time was, moving out to the city perimeter was just smart money for owners and clubs. Throughout the seventies and eighties with the cities in decline and with the available space for the huge parking monstrosities and pack-em-in stadiums out in the suburbs, small town ball floundered. Now, however, with walkable communities and city life being redefined by new architectural theories and live/work/ use development plans, ballparks (with their uncanny ability to fit into tight urban spaces) are showing the kinds of economic muscles that have long been ignored. In Greenville, SC, Fluor Field, home of the Greenville Drive, started a whole downtown renewal almost on its own. Long a destination for cultural events at the Peace Center,





Greenville was sorely lacking in the kind of downtown presence that really causes folks to identify with each other and their city. In the first four years of operation 110 new businesses were open or opening within a half mile of the stadium. Greenville's revitalized downtown area has since been toasted on many top ten lists featuring overlooked gems of towns. Charlotte could and should be next up on those lists.

Charlotte's history with baseball goes back more than a hundred years. The original Hornets were the baseball team here, folks, and, though, minor league ball got off to a bit of a rocky start, (the first club from 1892 folded after a short time), we've had pretty steady baseball in the Queen City since 1901. We've seen luminaries like Harmon Killebrew, fallen heroes like Jose Canseco and enigmatic legends like Moonlight Graham all play in Charlotte (in Graham's case, his entire career in one game). We've been affiliates of the Senators, Twins, Orioles, Cubs, Indians, Marlins and now the White Sox. Charlotte's been a secret baseball town for decades, and no one's remembered it until just recently. Why?

In 1985, after a fire investigators concluded was arson, Crockett ballpark burned down. The ownership never recovered. The replacement stadium was completely open-air, and that drove attendance down. Two years later, the team had a new owner and a short while later they hopped back across the border to Fort Mill, where they spent the next 20 years getting by as the afterthought of Charlotte sports. After all, with a brand new NFL franchise and a still serviceable NBA franchise, who had time to think of the ol' national pastime? There was always a steady stream of attendance there- the stadium was actually quite easy to get to- but typical to the era, it seemed to lose some of its pizzazz when taken so far out afield of the city that was their namesake. Finally, in 2011, the city pulled out a few landswaps and cleared the room for the new stadium.

It's a cherry spot, tucked away in a little section of Mint Street that you could easily drive right by and take little note. When you walk into the stands, though, and are greeted by that huge electronic scoreboard (biggest in the minor leagues- 30ft by 82ft) the space seems bigger than it really is- there are no bad seats in

the house, really. Even in the picnic section and on the home run porch, you're never so far away from the plate that the view suffers. Gameplay is close enough for you to be able to appreciate a pitcher's follow through, and you'll be hearing that violent smack of cowhide against cowhide in the catcher's mitt loud and clear. The bullpens are situated along the basepaths, so fans are definitely close enough to heckle the opposing team's pitchers as they warm up. Reportedly. OK, maybe actually- but that's baseball, right?

So, the burning question: should you go? Oh, hell yes. After an afternoon of ballpark beer and nachos and sun and an excellent win by the Knights over the Norfolk Tide, this writer was grinning ear to ear. The only thing lacking from the entire experience is the transportation aspect- you can either pay uptown prices for parking or you can take the bus into the Transportation Center and hike the three or four blocks over to the ballpark from there. Hopefully, the city will continue to follow up on this big investment they've made in our uptown and arrange some shuttles for us weary fans after a long bleary afternoon of hollering "Nice Mullet!!!" at the away team's relief pitcher.

Gideon Smith (of Gideon Smith and the Dixie Damned Band) is a pretty fascinating person. Accomplished producer and journalist Peter Donald, who has been a fan of Gideon's and has followed him for around ten years, would agree. This celebrated Woodstock resident would agree so much in this that about two years ago he called Gideon and said "let's do a movie on you".

Donald, having been an "idea man" at Fox and worked on such concepts as Cops and America's Most Wanted as well as having written for Rolling Stone and Vanity Fair, saw a story in Gideon Smith. This led to the making of an independent film about Gideon's music and his life entitled "the Warrior Spirit". This film is in the post production phase and was made kind of 'hit and run' earlier this year with friends of Gideon's making appearances. (Cameos included former members of Animal Bag who made it big with Polygram Records in LA and went to Head Bangers Ball back in the day.)

Mr. Donald wasn't the only one paying attention to Gideon's music. His music was on "The Sopranos" which got his foot in the door of the music licensing world. 
