


Sourcing makers, from the beginning, who have products that are responsible in the truest sense, Stephanie Woody of the brand-spanking new, local business, Rooted Rethinkery, knows that this is NOT an original concept. Luckily, Charlotte needs it. Market need is the best way to start a business. Living out west, Woody saw more responsive communities in which people brought their own bags to shop, they showed that they care by using reusable water bottles, and she saw filling-stations, for lack of a better description on my part. "Refilling and remembering to always be

prepared, knowing your personal responsibility, and really using ethically-sourced and packaged products is not new to any of us." Woody has been doing it for over a decade.

"We all know about the crisis at hand and, while, I am happy to have that conversation," Woody tells me that she is fully content in stepping off of the proverbial soapbox and providing real solutions. "Stop yelling at each other. (Like) here. Would you like this cup that you can take on your daily commute? Can I provide you with this jar to refill your baking soda?" Woody now has the platform, or home base, if you will, to provide real follow-throughs to the (important) questions, such as, "what can I do to be a (more) responsible consumer for that day-to-day item?" Very much so solution-oriented, Woody is not concerned that someone may 'rip off' her concept. She is open to being the catalyst that is shure to make our community more better.

Now calling Camp North End home, Woody is a welcomed, shure to be main-stay, shop that is truly being instrumental in "the movement". Most venue owners can only boast dedicating one corner of their store toward "the way". That's okay, you don't have to go full-eco. Do your part, no matter how small the contribution, and luckily, you have just now fallen upon a concept that is fully engrossed in the idea of economic and environmental accountability. She is not there to judge, nor shove any unsolicited education down your gullet. She long stepped off of her above aforementioned proverbial soapbox and is ready to present legitimate alternatives to things she used to b\*tch about. Ready to bring back the permanent razor, calling it "the last one you will ever own", and prepared to refill your lotions milkman-style, Woody has an Airstream, readying herself to stay put long enough for you to buy into this "environmental obsession" that my mom's

# FARM FRESH FLIP

CRAFT COCKTAIL RECIPE BY: SABRINA "THE LADY BEANS" HAYKO

As the nights get longer and the days get cooler, we find the holidays quickly approaching. It can be hard to switch gears and get into the spirit, but at least we can get into spirits. Some of us are hit with waves of nostalgia while others are busy passing down traditions to the next generation. It's time for friends, family, love, laughter, and, of course, booze to keep us sane.

There is one family who manages to capture the old and the new while still providing us with some of the best animal proteins you will find around Charlotte. Dana & Charlie of Windy Hill Farm in New London, NC started farming in 2006. In 2010, Charlie left his job in construction to farm full time. Dana followed a year later, leaving her drafting technician position, to join him. What began as a way for them to share experiences from their youth with their children while providing their family with healthy, naturally raised meats and eggs, has blossomed into a profitable business. Their chickens are truly free to forage and mainly eat grass, seeds, worms, bugs, etc., but they do have free access to feed composed of locallysourced, non-GMO grains with added organic minerals. There are no antibiotics, growth enhancers, chemicals, or fillers. Their chickens (as well as all of their other live stock) have it made and you can truly taste the difference in their eggs.

DAY DRANKIN' You can order from their online store. While you are there, grab some ground beef, chicken, steaks, and breakfast sausage. Pick up is available every Saturday year round at the South End Market in Atherton Mill or at the Charlotte Regional Farmer's Market on Yorkmont. - 2oz Blonde Whiskey from Asheville Distilling Co
  - 1 oz Liquor No 43

- 1/2 oz turbinado simple
- 1 WHOLE egg from Windy Hill Farm

- Add ice to shaker and shake all ingredients 'til cool, but not so much so that you water it down.

- Strain mixture from ice and throw ice away.
- Dry shake the strained mixture vigorously to create a frothy beverage.
- Pour into coup.
- Garnish with fresh nutmeg.



We, at My City Magazine, are suckers for that hidden gem. Nana's Fastfood & Seafood Mart is one of those. Located equidistance from the University area and center city / uptown, they serve both fast-food and fresh seafood (to take to the house for your fish fry) every, single day except for Sunday.

> You may recognise Hung from working on Scott Tang's food truck, Yummi Banh Mi (only the best Vietnamese food truck in Charlotte). Hung has come back full circle to work in his folks' spot. You can expect everything that you would find in a convenient store, including, but not limited to, a sign that suggests one pull up their pants plus that charm you want from that mom-n-pop. Consistency is the boss at Nana's, everything is cooked fresh-to-order, all of the product has that ocean smell, fresh eyes, that good slime, and red gills on that firm feel.

A personal favourite of mine, upon arrival for an interview, is that live testimonial from a longtime customer. Word of mouth is king, after all. Gregory McCown, a retired veteran around my age, sat beside me while waiting on his order, citing the flounder, croaker (which Hung tells me later is the biggest seller), and tilapia as his repeat / go-to orders.
